The book contains a resident and business directory, a full list of churches, educational institutions, orders, societies, city, county, and state officers.

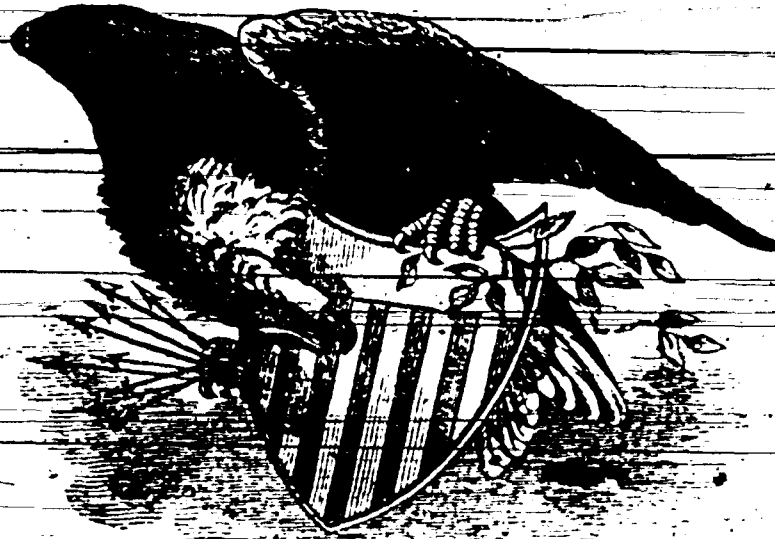

DES MOINES.

HER BUSINESS, COMMERCIAL AND MANUFACTURING INTERESTS—COAL MINES, RAILROADS, NATURAL ADVANTAGES AS A COMMERCIAL CENTER—THE NEW STATE HOUSE, THE NEW FAIR GROUNDS AND THE STATE FAIR, BUSINESS REVIEW, &c., &c.

The site on which the city is built is unsurpassed for beauty and pleasant surroundings. Situated at the junction of the Des Moines and Raccoon rivers, and occupying a sort of amphitheater, the bluffs rising by gentle acclivities on all sides, it affords fine residence sites, while the level portion is large enough to accommodate the business of a large city.

From the two rivers extend a rich and fertile plain, skirted with gently undulating hills, or bluffs which are covered with forest trees. Within the area encircled by these slopes a population of one hundred thousand can be amply accommodated with residences and yet not be crowded. The stranger is apt to be deceived in the number of inhabitants, from the fact that the residences are scattered far back on the wooded hills, where they are hidden from view.

The Des Moines river, which flows through the heart of the city, is spanned by four iron bridges 600 feet in length, while the Coon has also two bridges, affording to South Des Moines and the rich prairie beyond, easy communication with the various parts of the city.

In area Des Moines includes about twelve square miles, all suitable and laid out for building purposes. The city is growing with unprecedented rapidity, both in the erection of handsome and comfortable dwellings, and solid, imposing, and beautiful business blocks.

No city in Iowa presents so good a prospect for the future as Des Moines; no other gives evidence of more enterprise.

Unlike the Iowa cities on the Mississippi and Missouri, which are numerous, Des Moines has no rival. This will allow Des Moines to make a far greater growth than it could otherwise hope to attain.

For the Western trade, what town so favorably situated: With all the natural advantages that make it the market for the West, and insuring it cheap transportation from the East, it could not be better situated in reference to trade. — Indeed, the progress already made in this direction is some indication of what may be expected in the future.

The surface of the surrounding country is undulating, but in no places rough, and is beautifully diversified with wooded streams and open prairie. The ready market found at Des Moines for everything produced by the farmer, and the rich remunerative yield from everything planted in the soil, are rapidly enriching the farming community.

One of the great advantages which Des Moines claims, is, that it is backed by a farming country which can scarcely be excelled. Our rich farming land, which is the foundation of wealth, can never be moved. Our advantages are therefore, permanent, and not accidental. The natural advantages of Des Moines are plainly to be seen to-day.

It will be well for capitalists, and particularly for men of moderate means, desiring to acquire rapidly, to give their closest attention to the attractions which Des Moines now offers to them over any city in the west. The peculiar advantages of Des Moines must be apparent to the most casual observer; with lines of railway, north, east, south, and west.

With the present cheap rates of real estate, and in view of the large mechanical population which will be brought here in the construction of railroads, the establishment of manufactories, and other works, we know of no other place which presents better opportunities for the investment of capital, or which promises a more enduring prosperity.

Des Moines has every element necessary to make it a great manufacturing center. Coal is abundant and cheap. An inexhaustible water power is here, and railroads in every direction are ready to bring in the raw material and carry out the manufactured article. The success of the factories already established and the rapid settlement of the country tributary to the city, are warrants for the establishment of many more.

We take pleasure in noticing that Des Moines manufactures are equal in appearance and quality to the best products of eastern manufacturing cities, and we should give our home manufacturers all possible encouragement.

Coal is found in the vicinity of Des Moines in large quantities, supplying the city and vicinity, besides considerable quantities for shipment. Iowa coal is known as bituminous, and is equal in quality to coal of the same class found in other parts of the world, containing (as shown by analysis) only ten parts of im-

purities to ninety parts of combustible matter. Some fifteen mines are worked, located in and about the city; employing about seven hundred men. The demand for Des Moines coal outside the city has become so great that steam engines are used to facilitate the raising of the coal. Good coke is also made from this coal.

We deem it to be of the utmost importance to those seeking a desirable location for manufacturing, that other things being nearly equal, they locate in the place where fuel costs the least. It is almost a universally conceded fact amongst those engaged in manufacturing where great power and heat is required, that to be successful they must locate where fuel is cheap, and that this fact relative to our city, is fast being appreciated, and taken advantage of, is evinced by the rapid increase and growing importance of our manufactories.

If Eastern manufacturers would act wisely they will seek this much favored and very inviting field, this golden opportunity, when so cordial a welcome awaits them. The present year bids fair to be one of special interest and profit to those embarking in this department of productive industry. Hundreds of new enterprises can find room in our city.

Let us have manufacturing that will give constant employment the whole year round; that is the kind of labor that brings permanent prosperity with it.

THE POPULATION.

The United States Census of 1850 placed our population at 515. In 1860 it had increased to 4,111, and in the ten years immediately following the gain was 7,854, giving a total population in 1870 of 12,035. Since then our population has increased, until this year it will reach somewhere between 25,000 and 26,000. This is no fanciful computation, the estimate is three and one-half to the name, and we are warranted in using this ratio, as a careful canvass of the city shows 7,271 names which gives us 25,459; but, if we used the average four, used by some cities east and west of us, we could show a population even greater than theirs to-day.

The great increase in the population of the western part of our State renders the trade very important, and Des Moines soon, from its central position, seems destined to become the headquarters for the trade in Iowa, the metropolis of Iowa, and a city of 50,000 ten years hence.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND COLLEGES.

One of the greatest advantages of Des Moines is her excellent public schools—the buildings for which are valued at about \$50,000—employing seventy-two teachers, and having an attendance of nearly five thousand pupils. Among the illustrations given in this work is that of the Lincoln school building, one of the finest in the west, which was erected at a cost of \$80,000.

There are also two large and flourishing schools under the auspices of the Catholic Church.

The German American School is in a flourishing condition under the supervision of the German Turner's Association.

The University of Des Moines, under the auspices of the Baptist denomination, in addition to its great natural advantages of location, has a corps of instructors and curriculum of instruction second to no institution in the state, and is well worthy of patronage.

The Iowa Academy of Natural Sciences which has for its object the diffusion of scientific knowledge, is one of the most interesting and beneficial organizations in the city. Since its inception its growth has been constant, and its monthly meetings are gatherings of profit and pleasure.

The Iowa College of Law located in Spencer block, 5th street, is the Law Department of Simpson Centenary College. The course of instruction embraces the whole field of Elementary Law, as found in Blackstone, Kent and Walker, and especially the law of Real Property, Contracts, Torts, Equity Jurisprudence, Evidence, Bailments, Corporations, Agency, Partnership, Bills and Notes, Domestic Relations, Insurance, and Criminal, Probate and Constitutional Law, and Pleading and Practice, both at Common Law and under the Codes. The course of study is so arranged as to be completed in a single year, beginning in September and ending in June. It is divided into three terms, corresponding with the other departments of the College.

The advantages afforded by the Law School at the Capital of the State over any other place in it are manifest. Here courts, both State and Federal, are in actual, open session during every week of the college year; here is the most complete law library in the Northwest; here the statute law is made by the Legislature, and administered by the highest courts of the country; and here may be seen, day by day, during the entire college year, the practical application of the very principles of the law as they are taught daily in the school.

The State Library will be always open for the use of students

affording the most extended investigation possible of any law question.

For circulars or information address Hon. W. E. Miller, Dean of the Faculty.

There are few states that have as fine a library as Iowa. The law department is the best of any law library in the west. Within the last few years great improvements and additions have been made. There is an appropriation by the State of \$1,000 a year to purchase books of all kinds, so that there are valuable additions being made yearly. As a State we have reason to be proud of such a treasure.

For a city of twenty-five thousand inhabitants, Des Moines has more churches and better church edifices than any city of similar population in the west.

The Young Men's Christian Association have comfortable rooms in Boyd's block, 5th street near cor. Locust, where interesting Bible and prayer meetings are held every Monday evening. The Association is doing a worthy and efficient missionary work. They have charge of a large mission Sunday school at the Rock Island depot, and hold religious services each Sabbath in the county jail and the city hospital, and each alternate Sabbath at the county poor farm. They also give each year a very fine course of lectures and concerts.

The city library, which is under the management of an association of ladies, is in a flourishing condition, and occupies spacious and pleasant rooms in Art block on Fourth street. This association also gives a fine series of lectures and concerts during the winter.

There are in the city including laundries, machine shops, about forty factories, twenty-three miles of water main, fifteen of gas mains; probably about two hundred and fifty miles of sidewalks, with about the same number of miles of street.

The first buildings which were built into the city were the first houses which were built.

DEEP-ROCK SPRING.

It may be of some interest to our readers to know that on the Des Moines river, two and a half miles south of Des Moines, there is a delightful summer resort. The place is called "Deep Rock Spring," and is supplied with a large hotel, which has large, airy, well-ventilated rooms. The site is romantic, right in the edge of the woods. The hotel is but a few steps from the Des Moines river, where boating and fishing can be had in abundance. The object of the hotel is to give people an opportunity to drink the mineral water which flows in abundance from a well bored 215 feet through solid rock. The water has great curative qualities, and hundreds of invalids can testify that they have been benefitted by its use. The spring being so near to Des Moines makes it a desirable and pleasant resort. The number of visitors at Deep Rock Spring is daily increasing and will continue to increase as the merits of the water and accommodations of the hotel become known. Messrs. Plumb & Bennett are the proprietors. The time will come when Deep Rock will be one of the best curative establishments in the State.

THE COTTAGE HOSPITAL,

a most beneficent and praiseworthy institution, was opened July, 1878, for the reception of patients.

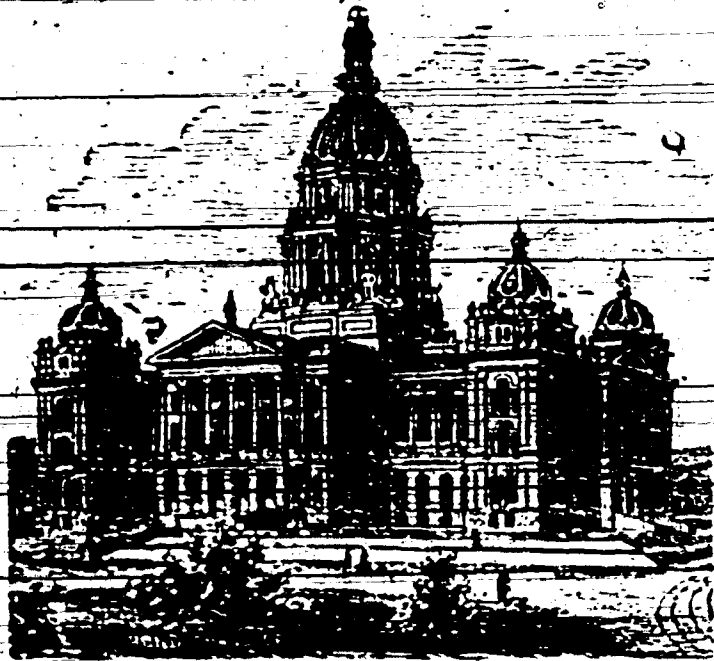
The property which is located on Fourth street above School, cost \$1000, and is now valued at \$1500, and is free from debt with the exception of \$75, which is provided for when due.

During the past year \$1400 have been raised by the citizens of Des Moines and the friends of the enterprise toward paying for the property and caring for the sick.

No patients are received having contagious diseases, but any and all who are sick, and have nowhere else to go, are cordially welcomed and kindly cared for. The medical treatment is given by the members of Polk County Medical Society. It is the desire of the present managers that the city should assume the charge of the hospital and enlarge its capacity for usefulness.

THE NEW STATE CAPITOL.



We are indebted to Hon. J. K. Powers, Register of the State Land Office, for the following very interesting description of the new State House:

There are few persons in the State who fully realize the magnitude and grandeur of this building, nor of the amount of material and labor necessary for its completion.

In the spring of 1871 the excavation for this building was begun, and since then it has slowly but surely risen until it now stands, on Capitol Hill, a lasting monument to Iowa's industry, wealth and liberality.

The style of the building is the Corinthian order of architecture, three stories high above the basement. The ground plan is in the form of a Greek cross with a pavilion at each of the four corners, on the north and south ends. The extreme length north and south is 360 feet, and the extreme width is 240 feet. The width of the east and west projections are 115 feet, and the north and south wings are 100 feet wide. The height from the basement to the top of the cornice is 93 feet, to the top of the roof 115 feet, and to the top of the main dome 275 feet. The basement walls are built of a strong crystalline limestone with a granite base course, and the walls above this are built of a buff colored sand stone, with trimmings made of a light blue sand stone. The contrast in colors is not great but pleasing to the eye, and the walls are so broken by projections, and the window and door openings are so diversified and yet so harmonious, that there can be no criticism. From a distance the building looks a little "flat" at present, but when

the central and four corner domes are completed, the sky line will be broken and much more pleasing; the four smaller domes are now completed, and we begin to see the effect as it appears in the "picture" or prospective drawing, which can be seen at any time at the office of the architects, in a building on the capitol grounds. The roof of the building appears to a casual observer to be everlasting; it is made of iron framework, covered with porous terra cotta blocks, and on this is laid the heavy slate, bedded in pure cement and nailed fast; the gutters and down spouts are of copper, and the roof of the domes will be covered with copper also.

Thus it will be seen there is nothing in the top of this building where most destructive fires originate, to burn, and as the floors throughout the building are made with iron beams and brick arches covered with marble or eucostic tiling in most cases, the State will need to pay out nothing for fire insurance. Under the whole of the capitol is a cellar ten feet deep which will be used for the heating apparatus; the basement story, which is above the ground line, will be used for storage purposes; in the first story, which is 24 feet high, are all the apartments for the State officers, including the Supreme Court room and private room for the judges; these rooms are made easily accessible by a broad corridor running through the building from east to west, and one of less width from north to south. In the center of the intersection of these two corridors is the rotunda, under the dome, 64 feet in diameter and open from this floor to the top, a distance of 250 feet. There are four broad stairways from this floor to the basement, and four to the story above and leading on to the attic. In addition to these there is the grand stairway in the east corridor leading to the floor of the House and Senate chamber and State library room. There are also two elevators in the building extending from the basement story to the attic.

The floors in the corridor, the wainscoting and main stairway will be made of marble; the other two stairways will be of iron, and the finish throughout be made as nearly fire-proof as possible. The second story will be devoted almost exclusively to the General Assembly. On this floor is the Senate chamber, 38x91 feet and 42 feet high; the House of Representatives, 75x91 feet and 48 feet high; the post office, and sundry rooms for clerks, committees, &c., besides the State Library, 52x102 feet, and capable of holding 150,000 volumes of average size. In the third floor are the galleries to the House and Senate chambers. All of the interior work, we understand, is to be finished in keeping with that already done, which is good, and

will do credit to the State, and to those having the work in charge.

The estimate for the completion of the work is \$733,067.00, making the total cost of the building \$2,250,000.

Thus far the work has been carried on by the State (for no contracts have been let except for material) without going in debt, and without increasing the levy of two mills on the dollar, which has raised the revenue of the State for so many years past. It is expected that the four corner domes or turrets will be completed this year, and the building will be completed so that the State officers can move in the fall of 1881, and the Legislature meet there in January, 1882.

RAILROADS.

There are about thirty different railroad companies in Iowa, some of which have several branches, and the number of miles traversed is about five thousand, so that our State has become a network of tracks in all directions, and the outlook for new lines is better at present than it has been for years. It is estimated that there are about twenty thousand persons in the employ of the various companies in Iowa at this time; so there are about one hundred thousand of the population of Iowa who derive their support from the railroads in the State, receiving about \$8,000,000 annually as wages.

It is plain to be seen then that our railroads sustain a very important relation in an industrial way to the people of Iowa, and contribute largely to the general prosperity.

In August, 1866, the first railroad reached Des Moines; now we have five, and two more will be in operation within a few months. Others are partially graded and one—the St. Louis line, an extension of the North Missouri, by way of Albia—will probably be in operation within a year.

No other city in the State is to-day so favorably situated as Des Moines so far as railroads are concerned. The growth of the city has been very rapid since the advent and opening of the railroads, which converge here from every part of the State, freighted with the various products of the richest agricultural region of the world, making the city the convenient market place for a large number of flourishing towns and villages.

Other cities for a long time have sought to become each the great railroad center of Iowa, and several cities of the State seemed to be courting the glory; but to-day it is confidently believed that Des Moines at no distant day will become the great railroad center of the State; will be to Iowa what Indian-

apolis is to Indiana. Indeed, all portions of the State are looking to Des Moines as the future metropolis of the great State of Iowa.

CHICAGO, ROCK ISLAND AND PACIFIC.

This road is one of the greatest (if not the greatest) lines across our State, connecting, as it does, at Council Bluffs, with the Union Pacific. It will compete with the eastern roads in transportation of freight and merchandise. The growth of commerce and trade of the west demand that this road should rank among the first in the land.

The road is kept in excellent condition, the rolling-stock is always up to the mark, and the comfort of its patrons is always carefully looked after.

The Chicago, Rock Island & Pacific railroad will this year replace some forty wooden bridges on their various branches with an equal number of iron ones.

The report of the president shows that the aggregate number of miles of road owned or controlled under lease by the company at the close of the fiscal year, was, including the Keokuk & Des Moines division, 1,231 miles, 825 miles of which are in Iowa.

The rapidly increasing passenger business has necessitated increased facilities and accommodations; and to meet the wants of travel, this Company are running a line of Palace Sleeping Cars between Chicago and Des Moines, in addition to their present system of through cars to Peoria, Council Bluffs, Leavenworth and Atchison.

W. E. Royce, the Division Superintendent, office at Des Moines, is a gentleman of ability and experience, and looks well to the interests of the road, and is highly esteemed by the citizens and business men of our city. (See the card of the company.)

DES MOINES, INDIANOLA AND MISSOURI.

Active measures are now in progress likely to lead to the speedy extension of this road across the east and west trunk lines of Southern Iowa to a speedy connection with the great railway system of Missouri. This is a branch of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad, and may well be considered of importance to Des Moines.

DES MOINES, WINTERSET AND SOUTHWESTERN.

This is also a branch of the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific Railroad. Its business has been very large, and its advantages to Des Moines are everywhere recognized. It is expected this branch will soon be extended southwest.

KEOKUK AND DES MOINES.

This road is in a better condition than ever. It is now a branch of Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific, and is being put in first class order in every particular. It is doing a larger business this year than ever, and is very important to Des Moines.

CHICAGO AND NORTH WESTERN, AND THE DES MOINES AND MINNEAPOLIS.

The North Western, like the C., R. I. & P., is an immense corporation. It is said that it runs and controls as many, if not more miles of road than any other company in America, and everything is kept in perfect order, first class in every respect. The gentlemen having the management of this road are evidently men of experience in railroad business.

The Northwestern now operates 489 miles in Illinois, 425 miles in Iowa, 504 miles in Wisconsin, and 197 miles in Michigan, a total of 1,616 miles. It also has a proprietary interest in the following roads: Winona & St. Peters Railroad and branches, 406 miles; Iowa Midland Railway, 68 miles, and the Northwestern Union Railway, 62 miles. The whole number of miles now operated by this great corporation is 2,151.

Des Moines is fortunate in this addition of the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad interests. The Northwestern have leased the Des Moines and Minneapolis narrow-gauge road, which will be reorganized, and the track from Ames to this city changed to broad-gauge, giving the Northwestern entrance to this city. The northward narrow-gauge route will be extended, and the road built to Minneapolis as a feeder.

The result of the reorganization, on the whole, will be beneficial to Des Moines, and the cars of the Northwestern road will be in Des Moines before long.

A broad-gauge will be laid from Ames to this city, thirty-eight miles, giving the Capital a direct road to Chicago, in competition with the Chicago, Rock Island and Pacific and Chicago, Burlington and Quincy, and from present appearances the Northwestern will run cars in here before the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy, although the latter are pushing ahead fast from Knoxville. So that, if we lose the narrow-gauge road, we gain one of the best and most extensive roads in the Union.

CHICAGO, BURLINGTON AND QUINCY.

The Des Moines and Knoxville road having passed into the hands of the C. B. & Q., men and teams are doing all that can

be done to complete the road to Des Moines early this next fall. This is built as an extension of the C. B. & Q. road, and so brings that corporation, with its thousands of miles of road into the service of Des Moines. They can succeed in doing this and they will. Their efforts have been constantly directed to this end and they will not relinquish it. The line is a popular one, and will be a trunk line to Des Moines that will always remain a competing line against any and all other roads we have now. The road will be built in a manner entirely protective of Des Moines interests, present and future. This will be of itself good news to Des Moines, for it settles the future greatness of the place as a railroad center and manufacturing point, and there will have happened to Des Moines the best thing that has happened to it since it got its first railroad. The Company have already bought depot grounds, on Elm street, between First and Fourth, where they will erect the passenger and freight depots. The road in every way will be put on a first-class footing. Express trains will be run from Des Moines to Chicago in full competition with the C., R. I. & P. and C. & N. W. railway lines. When this line is completed we can go to St. Louis as well as Chicago without change of cars. See the card of the company elsewhere.

DES MOINES AND FT. DODGE

This is the most important north and south line in the State. The business of the past year shows the wonderful advantage of the road, not only to Des Moines, but the entire State, as it connects with the lines running east and west. The above named road has been of most practical benefit to our city, and we must say that the citizens and business men realize it.

The company proposes an extension of the road north to a connection with the Milwaukee and St. Paul road. This will open up the trade with the pineries, and also furnish a market for the immense coal mines of Des Moines and central Iowa. The company's general offices are in Des Moines. C. N. Gilmore general Superintendent, and Geo. W. Ogilvie, general ticket agent, know how to manage a railroad successfully, being men of ability and experience in railroading.

COMING TO DES MOINES.

SUGGESTIONS THAT APPEAL TO THE INTERESTS OF DES MOINES BUSINESS MEN AS WELL AS THE PRIDE OF OUR CITIZENS.

The prospects of Des Moines in the railroad line this year are the most cheering, and it is not at all unlikely that by next

year, this city will have more railroads than any other city west of the Mississippi river.

The amount of railroad building actually going on in the central, western and northern part of the State is immense, and the long needed facilities being supplied.

There is no reason in the world why Des Moines, situated in the center of the foremost State in the west, should not become as great a city, in wealth and population, as either Indianapolis of Indiana, or Columbus of Ohio. In order to attain such a position, it is only necessary that her whole people act in concert in securing railways leading out east, west, north and south, tapping other lines already constructed that will bring them in connection with the markets of the Union. Situated in the valley of the Des Moines river, which abounds in timber and coal, it ought to be, and will be, if her business men say the word, and have sagacity enough to utilize the resources that nature has placed in her hands, a great manufacturing city, and then with a system of railways leading out in all directions, it would become one of the best distributing points of the northwest.

MINNEAPOLIS TO BE CONNECTED WITH THIS CITY BY RAIL THIS YEAR.

In the *St. Paul Pioneer-Press*, is the following news of interest to Des Moines:

"We are enabled to make a very gratifying announcement this morning, and one of interest and importance to St. Paul as well as Minneapolis. The management of the Minneapolis & St. Louis Railway Company has fully decided upon the immediate extension of their road from Albert Lea, the present southern terminus, to Ft. Dodge, Iowa, a distance of one hundred miles. The Minneapolis & St. Louis company have not only decided upon this extension, but have made all necessary preparations to crowd the work to an early completion this season. The necessary funds have been provided for, the iron has been purchased, and the entire work will be put under contract at once, with the determination that the Ft. Dodge extension shall be completed and the cars running between that point and Minneapolis before the snow lies. This will bring the immense coal fields of Iowa within 250 miles of Minneapolis and St. Paul, and will give the Minneapolis and St. Paul road connections at Fort Dodge with the Illinois Central railway, and the Des Moines and Fort Dodge road leading to Des Moines. It is an important gap to fill, and Minneapolis has every reason to congratulate herself upon the fact that it is to be done so speedily."

This will give Des Moines direct and speedy access to Minneapolis and Minnesota, and enable us to establish a system of exchanges with that State—exchanging our coal for its lumber. This is something both States long have needed, and now that this is to be had both States will be the richer for it.

All of which will be a further incentive to the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul to push its Western Union division to this city from Marion, a project now being worked up by able and wide-awake people.

MILWAUKEE, MARION, MARSHALLTOWN AND DES MOINES.

The *Marion Register* says:

For some time the people of Des Moines and Marshalltown, the two principal cities of Central Iowa, have been quietly canvassing a project for the extension of our Milwaukee railroad to the capital of the State, and, as will be seen by articles which we copy to-day from the papers of those cities a meeting has been held and preliminary steps taken to carry out the design referred to. A glance at the map will show that it is the best unoccupied field in the State for a road, and the interests that will be subserved by its building are certainly of sufficient importance to at once attract the attention of the officers of the M. & St. Paul Company and secure from them a friendly and efficient cooperation in the speedy construction of the road. The country through which it will pass, between this city and Marshalltown and thence to Des Moines, is beyond question the finest agricultural section in the State, richly improved, densely populated, and will furnish the road when built with a far better paying business than was secured by the Northwestern or the Dubuque and Sioux City when those roads were constructed westward across the State.

The project is a good one, a feasible one, and could be worked up and made successful if the people interested would only take hold of it—and it would give to Des Moines and Central Iowa direct connection with Milwaukee and another line to Chicago.

DES MOINES, ADEL AND WESTERN.

This line is finished to Adel and is being pushed rapidly forward. The company has purchased the right of way from Waukeec to the Missouri river, and the outlook for the speedy completion of this road is now very flattering. The subscribed stock has been assessed fifty per cent, and the money paid, so that the road is now assured.

DES MOINES AND MISSOURI RIVER.

The organization of this railway company has now been fully perfected,—the articles of incorporation having been filed with the Secretary of State. The Board of Directors is composed of the following named gentlemen: J. M. Tuttle, W. M. Jones, S. D. Nichols, Thos. Hatton, Jr., E. M. Ford, J. B. Heartwell, J. W. Mills, L. A. Grant.

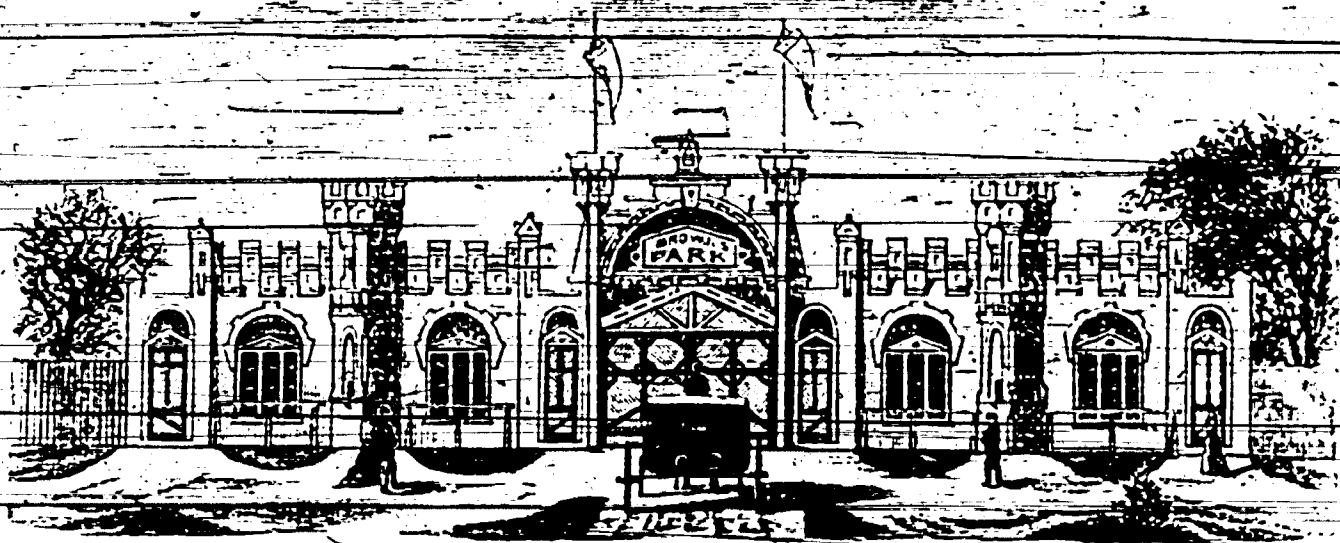
The following are the officers of the Company:—

Surveys of the different routes will be commenced under the direction of President Tuttle and Engineer Moore. The work will be pushed forward with all possible despatch. Money has been contributed liberally to pay the expenses of the preliminary survey. There is an intense anxiety throughout all the country interested, and work will be very lively along all the proposed routes from this on. There are three routes talked of, and any one of them would be a good one.

Other projected lines are spoken of, and we would not be surprised to see them speedily pushed forward. All Iowa is anxious to reach Des Moines by rail, already the great railroad center of the State.

DES MOINES WILL DO HERSELF HONOR.

The State Fair for 1879 will be the greatest industrial exhibition Iowa has ever held; greatest in the arrangement and elegance of its grounds; greatest in the display of products, stock, machinery and arts, and greatest in its orators and attendance. The executive committee are untiring. The city of Des Moines has put her shoulder to the wheel, and all Iowa must move.

The people of this great State ought to meet once a year, and there is no better place than on the fair grounds.

The location is extremely favorable for an exhibition of the best products of all the various departments of agriculture, and for a full attendance of farmers from every locality with the best trophies of their skill.

The buildings being put up on the Iowa State Fair Grounds are of a class to last for ages, and not of the sort to fall to pieces by their own weight.

For the first time in the history of the State Agricultural Society is the annual fair to be held within easy reach of all parts of the State. The people all over the State should make it a point to make calculations to attend this fair. Already are the grounds in such a state of preparation as to warrant us in saying that for beauty and harmony of arrangement they are to far surpass any grounds ever used as fair grounds before in this State. All the halls are to be of the most beautiful and tastv models. The grounds themselves and the arrangements of the necessary buildings and offices will well repay the trip to see them alone, to say nothing of what they will contain.

The grounds belong to Mr. T. E. Brown, and he intends to make it so attractive that he can make it useful, and in various ways remunerate, to recompense him for his large outlays. The grounds are artistically laid out with carriage ways and walks in good style, and ornamental-entrance and exit gates. The roadways are fenced to prevent trespass upon the lawns. The entire grounds have a tight board fence eight feet high. There are sixty acres in this enclosure, and there is to be ten acres of camping ground outside. There is already on the grounds a half-mile track which is to be fenced on both sides.

The grounds are ample, tastv and convenient. Mr. Brown has a first class architect, Mr. B. J. Bartlett, employed, and all the buildings are to be in artistic style, of which Mr. Brown has given assurance to any one who has seen the improvements in his new addition of the city of Des Moines. It will be a desirable place of resort and recreation as a park.

MAIN HALLS.

There are five large halls, as follows: Fine Art Hall, Floral and Fruit Hall, Vegetable Hall, Mechanical Hall and Power Hall. These halls are to be of the following dimensions; Fine Art Hall, 40x140 feet, with two wings, 40x50 feet each—in the shape of a Greek Cross. The Fruit and Floral Hall 32x100, with two wings 32x50 feet. Vegetable Hall 32x100, with one wing 32x50. The Mechanical Hall of ample size. Power Hall, size and style to be under direction of Committee, but to contain engine, boiler, shafting and pulleys.

All the foregoing halls are provided with tables, platforms, railings, etc.

OTHER BUILDINGS.

There is a building on each side of the main entrance gate, one for the treasurer and the other for the superintendent of gates and tickets. The office on the grounds for the President and Vice-President, 14x30, in two rooms, with veranda in front

six feet wide, furnished with tables, chairs, lights, two beds and bedding, stove, fuel, and to be under the care of a faithful steward. There is a Secretary's office, 36x24, with a wing 18x32, with a veranda on front and sides six feet wide.

JUDGES AND REPORTER'S STANDS.

A judges stand, octagon in shape, sixteen feet in diameter, two stories high, with flag and flag-staff. Also, a reporter's stand near by, supplied with seats and tables. There is also to be a comfortable room supplied in some other building for the headquarters of visiting editors and reporters, where they can meet and prepare their reports.

HORSE AND CATTLE STALLS.

There are 315 horse stalls built on the grounds—125 of which are single stalls 6x11 feet; 75 double stalls 8x12, and 75 open stalls. The first 200 close stalls, with door, and hasps for locks. There are also 40 stalls for jacks and mules. All these stalls are covered with board or shingle roof, and each stall numbered in large figures. Also 200 cattle stalls, and more if necessary.

HOG AND SHEEP PENS.

There are built 250 hog pens, 8x8, well floored and roofed, and supplied with troughs, doors, etc., and 10 sheep pens, 8x8 with troughs. All the hog and sheep pens are numbered in large figures. There is also a poultry (covered) stand ample enough to accommodate 500 coops.

Good wells are dug on the premises, and barrels are placed at different places and kept supplied with ice water and cups. And if necessary, Mr. Brown will keep the main thoroughfare from the city to the grounds well sprinkled. Also water troughs for stock are to be supplied with water.

DINING HALL AND AMPHITHEATRE.

The dining hall is 40x80 feet, with floor. The amphitheatre with a capacity to seat six thousand persons, with a promenade on top, is closely boxed on the under side, and the lower floor used for booths, divided off in sixteen feet rooms, the front hung with doors in a way, when raised, to form a roof, and so arranged as to be tightly and securely closed at night, and the whole covered with a shingle roof.

The fair ground is fixed up as a permanent thing whether the State Fair is continued here or not. In this enterprise the

city of Des Moines will be indebted to the liberality and enterprise of Mr. Brown.

STATE FAIR RACES.

\$4,300 IN PURSES.—The Iowa State Agricultural Society, at their annual fair from September 1st to 5th inclusive, propose to offer \$4,300 for trotting and running races, the entries to close August 27th.

THE PREMIUMS OFFERED FOR EXCELLENCE IN INDUSTRIAL WORK BY BOYS AND GIRLS.

A new and excellent feature of the State Fair, to be held in Des Moines the first week in September, is the large number of premiums, amounting in the aggregate to several hundred dollars, to be contested for by the boys and girls of Iowa. A separate department will be provided especially for the class of accomplishments to be exhibited in this line, and there ought to be lively competition from all parts of the state. This is the first time this feature has been introduced into our State Fair, and we do not think it has been adopted by any other Fair.

GIRLS' DEPARTMENT.—No entries can be made in this class by girls over fourteen years of age.

BOYS' DEPARTMENT.—Entries in this class must be made by boys who are under sixteen years of age.

The C., R. I. & P. R. R. are building a track from their road to the Fair Grounds, and will run regular and frequent trains from the city during the Fair, so ample as to take all the passengers at very reasonable rates. In this and other matters connected therewith, that company has been liberal in action.

STREETS AND AVENUES.

The city has widened the grade of the west end of Sycamore street, to the west limits of the city. From the west side of the city to the Fair Grounds a grand boulevard one hundred feet wide, has been nicely graded, and there is to be a street all round outside the Fair Grounds, thus giving free and pleasant access.

There will be a decided advantage of trade offered to all who come to Des Moines. That in itself is not a little circumstance. Fare will be cheap to Des Moines and all who visit us may rest assured they will be more than compensated for the outlay by the bargains they can get from our merchants. Visitors from abroad are assured that the whole city of Des Moines is behind this enterprise and every expedient known to enterprising merchants will be used to attract and amuse the thou-

sands expected. Many merchants are in the east purchasing goods with a view to an immense trade this fall. They have gone to buy cheap and propose to sell so as to establish reputations throughout the length and breadth of the State.

We learn through the officers of the State Society that the prospects for a complete and satisfactory State Fair were never more promising than at present. The grounds have been fitted up in first class style, and very convenient; water will be abundant; forage of the best quality secured; the track has been put in excellent condition; everything has been done to make the Fair valuable to exhibitors, and profitable and pleasant to visitors. The premiums are on a liberal scale, and every effort will be made to give satisfaction.

The preparation is only commensurate with the resources and pride of the Capital City, of Iowa, and what is demanded by Western Enterprise and Industry, that will be exhibited.

BUSINESS REVIEW.

EMBRACING ADVANTAGES OF LOCATION; BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES; COMMERCIAL, MANUFACTURING, AND JOBBING INTERESTS; HOME INSURANCE COMPANIES; NEWS PAPERS, HOTELS, BANKS, BUILDING ASSOCIATIONS, IMPROVEMENTS, AND FUTURE PROSPECTS, BUSINESS MEN, ETC. ETC. ETC.

Iowa is a most inviting field for capital. It is more inviting, presents more advantages to capitalists, than the capitalists of the country have yet been brought to discern. Our rich fields open to view, and prove to men of money that here are superior inducements for investment.

We have run a remarkable career, and attained to a proud and enviable position in the list of agricultural states. Generous as our soil is, in yielding a bounteous wealth at the touch of the plow, it repays the farmer no more liberally for his labor than the manufacturer would be rewarded for his, if he would but wisely use the superior location and resources he here would find.

If the history of the growth and development of western towns and cities teaches anything, it is this: that in the growth of cities, as in everything else, the saying holds good that "Providence helps those that help themselves." Those who wait for

something to turn up, who wait for improvements to come of their own accord, generally have to take it out in waiting.

Among the several cities of Iowa rivaling each other in rapid growth and solidity of prosperity, Des Moines now claims for itself indisputable pre-eminence. This proud claim, however warmly contested by other localities, certainly has basis in facts that may well challenge careful attention by the traveler. Rarely indeed can he record possession of position and surroundings, by a city site, of natural advantages and attractions, excelling or equalling those so richly bestowed upon our city.

Des Moines has water power enough to run all the machinery that would be necessary in manufacturing; and in addition there is coal in such great abundance that manufacturing establishments can be erected anywhere in the city and run at comparatively little expense. Every year is adding to our knowledge of, and attesting the importance of our vast coal deposits. Des Moines, in a word, has all the advantages and surroundings that are requisite to make a great city. It is safe to say that more Eastern capital is to-day looking toward Des Moines for investment than toward any other Iowa town.

In regard to railroad facilities but few cities of the west are better provided for. We recognize the fact that the railway possesses an unlimited power for usefulness, and nothing contributes more rapidly to the wealth of a country than the iron horse.

We have spoken of the various roads previously, but would add here that we do believe the time is not far distant when Des Moines will be the great railroad center of the northwest, as with almost every rising and setting of the sun our city takes an important step towards material greatness.

Viewed in the light of these facts, Des Moines possesses no ordinary interest; and he who studies the situation disinterestedly, will not undervalue its importance, or ignore its well-grounded hopes of future prosperity and greatness. It cannot hope to rival Chicago, or eclipse San Francisco, but it may reasonably expect to be the metropolis of Iowa.

IMPROVEMENTS.

It would require more time and space than we can now devote to the subject to enumerate the improvements and additions made during the past season. A large number of substantial and commodious business blocks, and costly and elegant residences have been erected; while the smaller homes built for and by our mechanics are almost innumerable. The Building associations, (which are given elsewhere,) have contributed largely in aiding our laboring classes to secure homes.

East and West also South Des Moines have been alike prosperous. The low rates of building material the past year or two has greatly aided us. Real estate in Des Moines is a good investment. There is now a prospect that our city will be more prosperous the coming year than ever. The new railroads that will be completed, the freeing of our bridges from toll, (which will make our city one in all her interests,) and the completion of the new capitol, together with the many improvements now in progress will add largely to our property the coming season.

We should make special mention of the improvements made (in what is called Brown's Addition in the northwest part of the city near Cottage Grove,) by Mr. T. E. Brown the past year, who has erected many fine residences and laid out the streets and blocks in first class style, which includes some of the finest residence sites in our city.

We learn from our builders and contractors that there will probably be an unusually large number of business blocks and dwelling houses erected the coming season, which will be one of unusual activity in building, and will witness a large and rapid growth to our city. Few cities in the west can present more actual progress than Des Moines.

The business of Des Moines has of late been most marked in the direction of its wholesale trade and manufactures. In dry goods, clothing, notions, boots and shoes, furniture, saddlery hardware, tinware, hardware, crockery and glassware, tobacco and cigars, and doors and blinds, there are wholesale houses whose customers are to now be found at all points west, north and northwest. Several of these are large establishments that would be no discredit to such cities as Chicago or St Louis. These houses have so energetically and successfully pushed their respective lines of trade, that not only a large part of Iowa, but Nebraska, Kansas, and the Territories are supplied with goods from our market.

The principal manufactories are furniture, foundries and machine shops, brass works, boiler works, plows and cultivators, wagons, carriages, sewer pipe, drain tile woolen mills, marble works, barbed wire fence, scale works, spice mills, hominy mills, flouring mills, oat meal mills, file works, broom factories, and many other smaller industries too numerous to mention, all of which are in a prosperous condition.

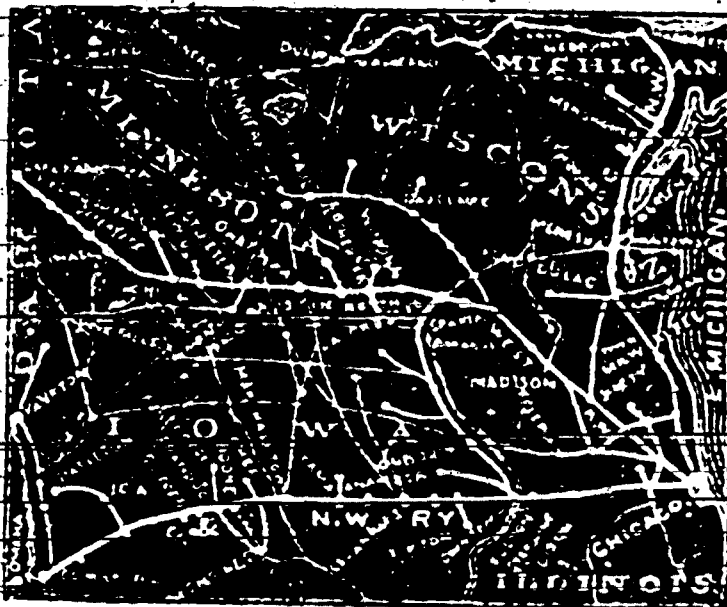
